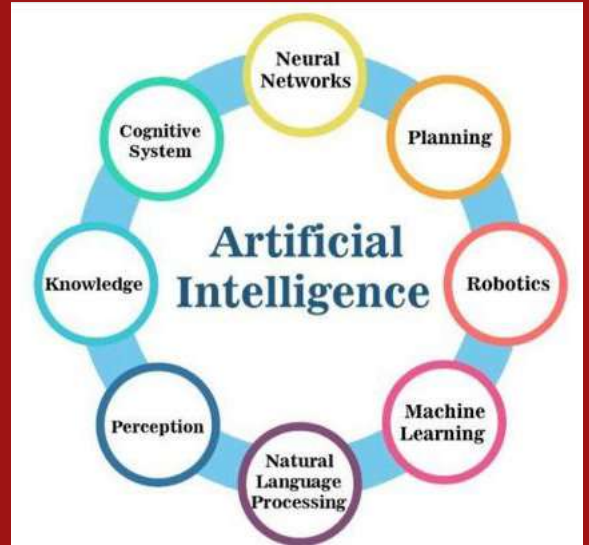


Yellow Day

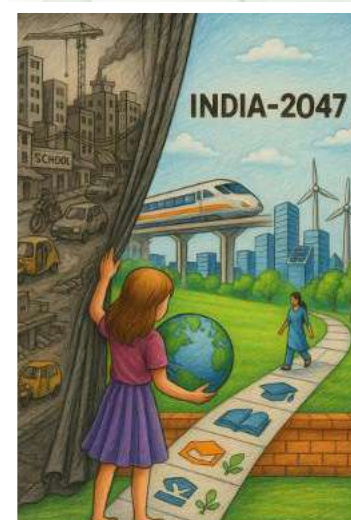
A developed India should be a place where every citizen is treated with respect, regardless of religion, caste, or gender. When people live together in harmony, the nation becomes stronger.

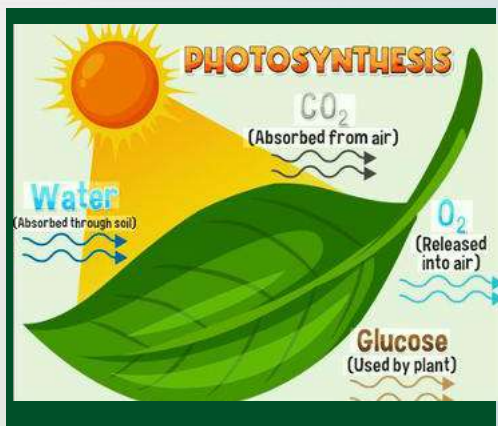
Usually defined by what we see, beauty holds great importance for all of us. While outward beauty may capture our attention, it is always the inner beauty that leaves a lasting impression.

THE EARTH'S INVISIBLE BANK ACCOUNT

As a science teacher, I often tell my students that science is not merely about formulas, diagrams and definitions. Science is about learning to see what the ordinary eye cannot see and implementing it in our daily lives.

We cannot see **gravity**, yet it holds us to the Earth.

We cannot see **electricity**, yet it powers our world.

Similarly we cannot see **carbon dioxide** accumulating in the atmosphere, but its consequences are becoming increasingly visible.

Perhaps it is time to imagine something unusual.

The Planet Earth has an invisible bank account.

Its currency is **carbon**.

Every **tree**, every **forest**, every **wetland** and every **healthy soil system** acts like a natural **carbon vault**. Plants absorb carbon dioxide during photosynthesis and store carbon in their biomass. Oceans and soils also hold enormous quantities of carbon, but human activities have disturbed this delicate balance.

So scientists and economists have developed an interesting idea **Carbon Credits**.

A carbon credit broadly represents one metric tonne of carbon dioxide equivalent (**CO₂e**) that has been reduced, avoided or removed, depending on the particular carbon credit system.

It is like an **environmental receipt**.

If a project prevents or removes a certain amount of greenhouse gas emissions, that reduction can potentially be quantified and represented through carbon credits, and suddenly something invisible becomes measurable.

Once something becomes measurable, people can begin to value it.

This is where **science** meets **economics**.

A company that reduces emissions may generate credits under an applicable system. Another organisation that needs to compensate for some emissions may purchase eligible credits. In this way, carbon markets attempt to put an economic value on reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

Carbon credits can be useful tools, but they should never become an excuse to continue polluting carelessly.

Our classrooms can become places where a different kind of carbon accounting begins.

Imagine a school carbon ledger.

Every time we switch off an unnecessary light is a **deposit**.

Every time we walk instead of taking a vehicle for a short distance is a **deposit**.

Every time we reduce food waste is a **deposit**.

Every time we reuse a water bottle or any school resource is a **deposit**.

Every tree we **nurture** rather than plant for a photograph is a **deposit**.

Every student who learns why climate change happens and teaches someone else is an **investment**.

Actually the most valuable investment is changing our mindset from:

"What can Earth give us?"
to

"What can we give back to the Earth?"

Plants take carbon dioxide that we cannot see, and transforms it into something essential for life (oxygen).

So we should not simply tell students the definition of "carbon footprint" but rather they should ask themselves ;

"What is my footprint?"

"What choices created it?"

"Can I reduce it?"

"Can I influence others?"

This is the difference between **knowing science** and **living science**.

Perhaps the future will define progress differently :

Not by how **much we produce**, but by how much we **preserve**.

Not by how **fast we grow**, but by how **responsibly we grow**.

Not by how **much energy we consume**, but by how **wisely we use it**.

The Earth does not need us to be **perfect**.

It needs us to be **conscious**.

Every great environmental changes begin with **small decisions**, and perhaps somewhere in the invisible bank account of our planet .

Something far more precious is ;

The possibility of a future.

As a science teacher , our greatest responsibility is not merely to teach how the world works, but to inspire how the world must continue to work.

If our students inherit a greener, healthier and more compassionate planet, that will be the most meaningful experiment of all.

The experiment called: Tomorrow.
